Boulder chef nominated for 'Rising Star'

A Boulder chef is the first in Colorado to be nominated for the "Rising Star Chef of the Year" award, given to chefs ages 30 or younger by the James Beard Foundation.

The annual awards often are referred to as the "Oscars of the food world."

Lachlan Mackinnon-Patterson, chef and owner of Frasca Food and Wine, was nominated for the award that recognizes young, talented chefs who are expected to significantly impact the culinary industry in the future.

A panel of at least 300 people identify top chefs from around the country, and judges then vote to narrow the list.

Mackinnon-Patterson is one of five final nominees. He will join the four others at an award ceremony in New York City on May 8.
